## General Manager's Message - Joel Barth

Things came to an abrupt halt this Fall once the weather turned. October began with temps in the 80's and ended with a couple of weeks of cool very wet weather. Our extremely active golf season lost a significant number of playable days throughout October because of undesirable weather conditions. A below average April and a subpar October did not hinder a record number of players we experienced in 2023 at the Lakes and the Pines. April and October can often times enhance golf numbers but are never counted on to be needle moving contributions. All in all, a very satisfying season from a golf business and profitability standpoint thanks to all of you that contributed to the successes.

It is now the time of year that we always attempt to predict the future - our budgeting and forecasting season. Now that we have navigated our way through the prime revenue producing months of our fiscal year, we look to the future and assess what the expectations will look like moving into our 2024/2025 budget cycle. After several years of marked improvements from our revenue producing areas, it becomes increasingly more difficult to predict how long we can sustain a significant increase each year. As I have mentioned and chronicled often, our revenues once again outraced the expenses of running a business which are showing no indication of slowing. Coming off a season that encompassed one of the most significant drought periods ever experienced makes golf round predictions for next year quite the crapshoot. Obviously, very few rounds of golf were lost due to weather throughout the prime months of the season. Can we count on this again next year? Probably not! It would be imprudent to predict golf numbers anything better than flat or stagnant. Another part of the budgeting process is determining where our expenses will land and what our pricing/rate structures will look like. I am pleased to report that golf passes, golf car passes, greens fees and cart fees will not increase for

members in 2024. This was a unanimous decision by our Board of Directors at the November meeting.

John Rember, our Chef and Kitchen Manager, is retiring at the end of the year. John has enjoyed two tours of duty at Lake Arrowhead and has been one of the most dedicated, loyal staff members I have ever had the pleasure to work alongside. John made his return to Lake Arrowhead in June of 2021 shortly after we opened the new clubhouse. When John and I started the dialogue in the Spring of '21, he assured me he would give us two or three good years and he certainly lived up to that promise as '21, '22 and '23 have exceeded all expectations in the area of food and beverage. John has always displayed amazing professionalism with a low key, cool under fire demeanor. Friendly, upbeat, good natured and amiable would be other accurate descriptive words. He will definitely be missed as he was such a critical piece of the puzzle with our recent successes. John has mentioned to me on several occasions that his phone will be on, and he is very willing to assist in a pinch or when we have an extremely busy event schedule. Thank you, John, for all of your tremendous, and delicious, efforts over the years!! Enjoy your well-deserved retirement!

Catalino Jaimes – better known as "Cat" will assume the duties upon John's departure. Cat began his tenure at Lake Arrowhead in August of 2022 and quickly made his presence known in a very positive way. Prior to coming on board at Lake Arrowhead, Cat spent 20 years leading the kitchen activities at Bullseye Country Club in Wisconsin Rapids. We are extremely pleased and fortunate to have Cat here and wish him well as he takes the reins.

Lastly and most importantly, I would like to thank everyone for a successful 2023 at Lake Arrowhead. I hope that all of you enjoy a safe, healthy holiday season.

### Common Areas Committee News

The Common Areas Committee has completed its monthly meetings for 2023. Our meetings are always the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday from April through October. As our amenities age, they are constantly being reviewed annually to determine if more repairs/ upgrades are necessary to preserve them for future generations. After reviewing all the properties in Spring, the committee suggests what issues are critical, research possible solutions, and acquire a possible projected cost throughout the Summer. A wish list is then sent to the board for review in the Fall to be included in the following year's budget. The properties reviewed this past year included the Chalet, West Lake Center, North Lake Center, South Lake Center, Mid Lake Center, Campground and Sports Field, along with the Clubhouse.

With the Lake Arrowhead Board of Directors and Management Team's approval of the 2023 budget, this past summer's projects included the boat landing approaches and ramps at the Mid Lake Center and South Lake Center were completely redone. The South Lake Center Pavilion ceiling boards were discussed and found that they need cleaning and refinishing, due to mold growth and discoloration to the boards. After looking at estimates for cleaning and refinishing, the committee

looked at alternative materials, also quite costly. The Lake Arrowhead board accepted our suggestion for a more cost-effective repair of removing the ceiling boards and not to replace them, but enhance it with cleaning of the rafters and possibly adding ceiling fans, such as the North Lake, Sports field, and Lakes Course pavilions, for Spring of 2024 by the LAA Maintenance crew. The North Lake Center floating docks/piers, and stairs were replaced this Fall. Some work updating the clubhouse pool tiling and walls was completed this fall, with completion in Spring of 2024. Also, you will find a new flagpole at the clubhouse which was dedicated last May. There are many other minor repairs/ upgrades that Steve and our maintenance department included in their daily tasks. They will be repairing/replacing the original exterior lamps at the Chalet. We thank Steve and his crew for their work.

Committee's proposed 2024 projects pending board approval: The committee has submitted a Cost Sharing Assistance Request for Shoreline Protection for the West Lake Center to the Adams County Land and Water Conservation Department. We are eligible for a 50% cost share. This shoreline restoration project, due to erosion, will be completed in Spring, along with some association funds to help cover the costs. Repairing and sealing the Clubhouse parking lot will be completed in Spring. The remainder of the Clubhouse pool restoration will be completed in Spring 2024. Among the potential 2024 projects will be concrete deck work at the Chalet pool along with a restoration project similar to the one we are in the midst of completing at the Clubhouse pool.

Lastly, Winter will soon be here and Lake Arrowhead has much to offer for some great winter activities. The Pines course golf cart paths will be groomed for cross country skiing with snowshoeing allowed along the side of them. There is ice fishing on Lake Arrowhead with access from Mid Lake and South Lake boat landings. There is a sledding/tubing hill at the heated Chalet which can be used at your own risk. The #9-10 Pines Course pond, in front of the clubhouse, will be cleared and can be used for ice-skating. The Rome Sno-Bandits have snowmobile trails marked throughout the Lake Arrowhead property as well as around the Town of Rome. Please continue to use and enjoy all the amenities that Lake Arrowhead has to offer, throughout the entire year. Please take care and respect our facilities.

On November 4th we completed our 2.5 month Nanobubbler test at the Lake Arrowhead Marina. Preliminary results look very good with oxygen absorption in the muck vs. anaerobic conditions before the test. We also noted increased clarity and a reduction of muck close to shore. Our engineers, EOR, conducted a hardness mapping of the marina before and after the test and we are waiting for the rsults. We are also waiting for results of the oxygen levels in the marina and had already noted an increase in oxygen levels after the first 2 weeks. We recently met with Dan Baumann, the WIDNR Secretary's Director, West Central WI, and our local DNR Rep along with the Nanobubbler Rep, Chris Stephan, Representatives from the county and Tri-Lakes board members to discuss the use of this technology going forward. We are currently awaiting a meeting with DNR staff from the main Madison office to work out details as this is a new program for the DNR and requires information of its effects on the lakes, fish habitat, vegetation and algae reduction.

The Tri-Lakes board voted to move forward with this project and have Moleaer work out all the details for costs, installation, expectations and other details. When we have this information we expect to call a special meeting of the Tri-Lakes electors and go over the project start to finish. Stay tuned!

At our 11/16 board meeting we had a review of our financial position from our auditors, Hawkins Ash, and again received the highest rating relative to our financial results.

We were notified of a minor leak in the Lower Lake Camelot Dam and the county is working on a report to resolve the issue. Check our website for additional information as we receive it.

The Tri-Lakes board was asked by the town to author a Lake Condition report for their consideration for a possible wake boat ordinance. This is required by the DNR for consideration on any ordinance related to the waterways. We will post the report on our website for your perusal.







## Lake Arrowhead Things to Know

This is a summary of restrictions only. A full copy of the **DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIONS, COVENANTS AND EASEMENTS** can be found at "lakearrowheadgolf.com/about/links" scroll down to download.

The restrictions, covenants and easements are imposed to promote the quality of life of the community by establishing standards for development.

#### **V. RESTRICTIONS**

- 1. No outside toilet or privy may be erected in the Community, except by the Developer.
- 2. No person may introduce any diseased or noxious plant, animal or insect.
- 3. No activity which interferes with the privacy of any other person.
- 4. No noxious, offensive, or illegal activities shall be tolerated on any tract.
- 5. No business can be run on any residential parcel.
- 6. No mobile home may be placed on any tract other than on mobile home lots.
- 7. No camping, except on lots designated for that purpose.
- 8. The only furniture allowed outside of buildings is lawn furniture.
- 9. Removal of trees and vegetation are restricted. Clear cutting must be approved with building plans.
- 10. Building techniques must guard against erosion.
- 11. Once construction begins, it must be completed in three months on mobile homes and nine months on residential lots.
- 12. No occupation until water and sewer are completed.
- 13. No stripped, partially wrecked, or junked motor vehicle, trailer, boat, refrigerator, stove/other appliances, or any other salvage item of any kind shall be permitted.
- 14. Fuel storage tanks must be buried or screened by fencing or shrubbery.
- 15. Clotheslines shall be placed so they are out of view. NOT allowed in EASTBRIAR.
- 16. All tracts shall be well-maintained.
- 18. Any damaged structure must be rebuilt or repaired as quickly as possible.
- 19. Only one mobile home allowed on a mobile home lot and must be 500 sq. ft.: a minimum length of twenty-two (22) feet and one (1) accessory building.
- 20. All structures must conform to local building codes.
- 21. Setbacks for buildings are 35 feet from FRONT LOT LINE (100 feet for Spotted Fawn), 10 feet from SIDE LOT LINES & 25 feet from REAR LOT LINES.
- 22. No parcel or lot shall be divided or re-divided, except as is otherwise specifically provided in the declaration.
- 23. Nothing may be done on any residential lot, which alters the surface drainage patterns in such a way as to be detrimental to any other tract in the Community.
- 24. SEE RESTRICTIONS FOR COMMERCIAL LOTS.
- 25. The committee MAY ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS governing the burning of trash, rubbish, grass, brush and other materials anywhere in the Community.
- 26. Only ONE single family in a dwelling lot.
- 27. Dwelling must have a minimum of 760 sq. ft. Fairway, Waterfront or Restricted lots must be 1000 sq. ft., 1400 sq. ft. in EASTBRIAR.
- 29(a). All associated structures shall be built of NEW MATERIALS. Place of USED structures shall be prohibited.
- 29(b). No animals other than normal pets such as cats & dogs- two each is the MAXIMUM.
- 29(c). NO SIGNS. (Including, but not limited to, "For Sale", "For Rent", or similar signs) billboards or other advertising structure of any kind may be erected or maintained anywhere in the Community.
- 29(e). No trees over six (6) inches in diameter shall be removed, except as necessary for construction.
- 29(j). "Subdued Natural Tones" which is compatible with the usual esthetics of the surrounding natural environment. "The Committee shall be the final judge of what constitutes "subdued Natural Tones".
- Any construction work on any residential lot, with the cost of at least \$100.00 REQUIRES approval of the committee.
   Complete plans for any proposed associated structure or other construction work is required.
  - In the event that you have received approval from the Town of Rome for your building project, YOU MUST COME TO LAKE ARROWHEAD A&E COMMITTEE FOR APPROVAL OF OUR COVENANT AND RESTRICTIONS "BEFORE" ANY CONSTRUCTION BEGINS!
